(DLA)?



DLA is a benefit that gives you extra money that you might need to look after yourself if you're under 16.

	You can get DLA if you:
16	Are under 16
+	and
	Have a disability, illness or condition



DLA has 2 parts

1	Part 1 is called Care
	This is if a child needs help with daily tasks like:
	Eating
	Washing
	Getting dressed
	Taking medicine
	Using the toilet
	A child can get the Care part from birth. The first payment will be 3 months after the birth

The care part has 3 rates:
Higher
Middle
Lower

A child may get the higher rate if:
They need a lot of care during the day and night
They are nearing the end of their life

	A child may get the middle rate if:
	They need an average amount care during the day and night
+	They need help with regular treatments and medication


A child may get the lower rate if:
They need a small amount of daily care

(2)	Part 2 is called Mobility
	This is if a child needs help with:
	Standing
	Walking
5	Moving inside their home
	Travelling outside of the house
?	Planning a journey

The mobility part has 2 rates:
Higher
Lower

A child may get the higher rate if:
They cannot walk
They can only walk a short distance

A child may get the lower rate if:
They can walk but need support
They need someone to watch over them while they walk





The Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) are in charge of DLA
The person looking after the child must make the claim

If you are the child's parent , you must be aged 16 or over to make a claim
If you are the child's carer , you must be aged 18 or over to make a claim.
The person making the DLA for children claim can:
Be workingHave savingsHave other money coming in

	Then, the DWP will send you a form in the post
	Put as much information in the form as possible

		Include copies of medical letters if you can
6		You will have 6 weeks to complete your form and send it back.
		What can a Doctor do to help?
	SR1	You can ask the child's doctor for a form called "SR1"
		They will complete the SR1 form and send it to the DWP
