





This year has been challenging for Share as we struggle to maintain excellent services in the face of harsh cuts in public spending. However, there have been some exciting new developments.

enabled to reach their full potential.

Winning with Work is our joint commissioned employment scheme, working with people who have severe and enduring mental health conditions and who now want to get back to work. At a time of high unemployment, finding a job is not easy, but we've had some great successes, and are working with some forward-thinking employers.

Other areas of achievement include Ground Control, our gardening social enterprise (now known as Share Gardening), which is taking on external contracts; our music project, which is now stocked with new instruments, thanks to the Leeds Building Society, and enjoying the monthly workshops with the London Symphony Orchestra; our catering project, which is starting to cater for outside events; and our new employability programme, GRoW – Getting Ready for Work.

Partnership work can lead to innovation and the best use of resources, which is what we found when we worked with Happy Computers and Viridian Housing to provide a computer course for profoundly deaf people. We also worked closely with Springfield Hospital's planning department to create a vision for the grounds in the approved development of the hospital site.
